The story of Rama is one where Vishnu (Preserver) comes to preserve the world by helping good win over evil. Diwali is celebrated all over the world, not just in India. The biggest celebrations in the UK are in Leicester. Diwali is a joyful time. Houses, shops and public places are decorated with small oil lamps called divas. People enjoy fireworks and sweets. Food is prepared and gifts are given.
